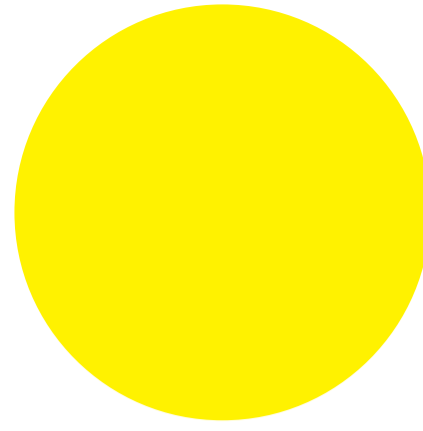

Raisi: US has blood of Gazans on its hands

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi expressed deep regret over the unwavering support of the advocates of human rights, especially the US, of Israel's crimes in the Gaza Strip, saying Washington has the blood of Gazan civilians on its hands. Addressing an international conference dubbed the "Tehran International Conference on Palestine" on Saturday, the Iranian president also denounced the ineffectiveness of international organizations over what is happening in Gaza. Raisi said, "Today, everyone is witnessing that the outcome of the current unjust world order is the horrific war crimes and

the massacre of women and children in Gaza," stressing that the people of the world should consider shaping a new world order. Referring to US support for the Israeli regime in its onslaught on the Gaza Strip, the Iranian president said that the US has the blood of children and women of Gaza on its hands by vetoing the UN cease-fire resolutions and military support for the Israeli regime, which has killed more than 20,000 people in Gaza since October 7. On December 8, the US vetoed a resolution at the UN Security Council put forward by the United Arab Emirates and backed by over 90 member states to establish a lasting humanitarian cease-fire in the Gaza Strip.
