Iran targets Israel's positions; warns US after attack on nuclear sites

Tel Aviv launches new attack on Fordow

Iran and Israel on Monday traded fresh strikes in a second week of the regime's aggression against the Islamic Republic and a day after the United States launched attack on Iran's key nuclear

According to the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC), Iran's Armed Forces fired missiles and drones at Israel's targets in the occupied territories during the 21st wave of strikes as part of the Operation True Promise 3.

The IRGC said it used multi-warhead Kheirbar missile to target Israeli positions in north, south and center of the occupied territories. It underlined that the attacks on Israel will continue until the objectives are met.

Iran's Army also launched drone strike on the regime's targets in the early hours of Monday. An Israeli Hermes drone was also destroyed by the Iranian air force in Markazi Province.

According to Israel's electricity company, the new wave of Iranian missiles disrupted the electricity supply to "sev-



eral communities" in southern Israel on Monday.

The strikes on Israel came in response to the regime's unprovoked attacks on Iran which have so far claimed the lives of more than 400 Iranians and wounded over 3,000 others.

Tehran's provincial governor Mohammad Sadegh Motamedian said on Sunday that more than 200 places in the Iranian capital Tehran have been hit in the Israeli strikes since the start of the regime's aggression on June 13.

The Israeli regime also on Monday targeted several locations across Iran.

US President Donald Trump claimed on Sunday that Iran's Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan nuclear facilities were "completely and totally obliterated."

Iran on Monday warned the US of severe repercussions following the strike which involved submarines and stealth B-2 bombers.

"This hostile act... will widen the scope of legitimate targets of the armed forces of the Islamic Republic of Iran and pave the way for the extension of war in the region," said armed forces spokesman Ebrahim Zolfaghari.

"The fighters of Islam will inflict serious, unpredictable consequences on you with powerful and targeted (military) operations," he said on state television.

Britain's Foreign Secretary David Lammy told BBC Breakfast the situation was a "moment of peril" and urged Iran to avoid retaliating against US bases in the region. He also warned that blocking the Strait of Hormuz by Iran would be a 'catastrophic mistake'.

In another development, Anwar Gargash, an advisor to the president of the United Arab Emirates, denounced extremist Israeli Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich's demand for funding from the Persian Gulf Arab States for the Israel's war on Iran.

Tehran views global inaction as 'complicity in injustice'

At a weekly press conference in Tehran on Monday, Iran's Foreign Ministry spokesman stated that turning a blind eye to oppression, injustice, and evil makes one complicit. Esmaeil Baqaei went on to explain that if one looks back at the regional developments in the past 80 years, or even just the last two years, it becomes clear that the global community's failure to step up against the Zionist regime's crimes has allowed its aggressions and atrocities to escalate.

count for their roles.

Bagaei emphasized that the world, the Iranian nation, history, and future generations will never forget that Iranians were militarily attacked by a country involved in the conflict just two days before the sixth round of diplomatic talks.

"[The United States' military] act was a betrayal of diplomacy, dialogue, ethics, human civilization, and all the achievements of eight decades of international relations and law since World War II."

Nonetheless, he affirmed that diplomacy will never

"European countries that are now comfortably making excuses for this regime's violations will certainly not be safe. Sooner or later, the Zionist regime will similarly go after Europe under pretexts it cooks up itself. By then, it will be too late for regrets," he warned.

He continued that Iran must not back down from its principled approach due to the malice and bad faith of the opposing parties. Iran's steadfast commitment to dialogue and diplomacy "should not be seen as a weakness," the spokesperson stressed.

He noted that the three European countries and the European Union are legally part of the JCPOA and UN Security Council Resolution 2231, and as long as this resolution stands, the responsibility lies with them. Therefore, Iran's engagement with these countries aims to hold them to ac-

lose momentum.

He condemned the US attack on Iran's peaceful nuclear facilities at Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan — all under full and continuous IAEA safeguards — on Sunday as "a completely illegal and criminal act," emphasizing that no country or any international body can justify this aggression in any way.

There is no longer any doubt that the military aggression was coordinated and backed by the United States. Thus, the US is an accomplice in all crimes committed over the past 11 days."

He reminded everyone, "Always keep in mind: We did not set off this war; it was imposed on us."

According to the spokesperson, Iran is holding talks with other countries, even those without formal diplomatic ties, believing this issue goes beyond any single country or a group of actors.

Global protests erupt against US, Israeli strikes on Iran

Following the announcement of US airstrikes on Iran's nuclear facilities and the recent brutal attacks by the Zionist regime to the country, a wave of protests and demonstrations has erupted across multiple countries worldwide. People and peace advocates in major world cities took to the streets to oppose war, and

In the United States, thousands of citizens gathered in key cities including New York, Washington, Boston, Chicago, and Los Angeles. These protests, organized under the banner "Emergency Gathering," featured demonstrators waving Iranian flags and holding placards with slogans like "No to War with Iran," calling for an immediate halt to US military actions.

In Washington, approximately 200 people assembled in front of the White House, while sizable protests also took place in Times Square of New York and along main streets in Chicago.

The Japanese people also

held a demonstration near the American embassy in Tokyo against the actions of Washington and Zionist

Meanwhile, in Germany groups opposing the conflict convened in Berlin. They called for an end to military conflicts, condemning Zionist regime and US incursions and attacks, and emphasizing the need for diplomatic solutions to resolve ongoing disputes

Most demonstrations remained peaceful, aiming to voice public concerns to policymakers.
